The two individuals in Row 16 refused services. The first individual was assessed and it was deemed that they did not qualify or want CMH services and were recommended that the family would benefit from counseling in the private setting. The second individual stated that they did not want CMH services and wanted to remain with their current private provider. Sanilac CMHA always respects the choice of guardians and individuals.

The data for this report is collected through an EMR. Sanilac CMHA utilizes a PCE product named OASIS.

Eligibility of individuals starts with the Region 10 Access center. Individuals are screened during a phone intake to determine eligibility. Once the individual is scheduled at Sanilac CMHA they are assessed face-to-face or via telephone based on the individual's choice.

Many individuals may not meet eligibility due to the level of severity that is assessed during the intake process. Fortunately Sanilac CMH is now a CCBHC site and is able to see those that may not otherwise qualify. Another trend is a lack of dependable transportation. Sanilac CMHA works closely with Sanilac Transportation Authority to aid in transporting individuals to and from CMH appointments.
